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OUR STORY

Over 18 years ago founder Michael Douglas set out to make a difference to the oncology services that saved his life when he was treated for leukaemia in The Chartwell Cancer and Leukaemia Unit in the Princess Royal University Hospital, Farnborough, Kent. Back then Michael made a commitment to addressing staff shortages and upgrading facilities to alleviate pressure on our NHS — a commitment that stands strong today.

Over the years we have expanded into two charities, The Chartwell Cancer Trust and The Chartwell

Children's Cancer Trust, dedicated to changing the lives of oncology communities throughout London and the South-East. Year-on-year we have scaled up our projects and our reach, working with an ever-growing network of local and major NHS hospitals to touch the lives of all individuals in our communities who are affected by cancer or leukaemia.



Over the years, The Chartwell Cancer Trust's support for the Tiger Ward, Queen Elizabeth Hospital, has made an immeasurable impact on the patients and staff within it. From the funding an HCA post, a new kitchen, refurbishments, clinical and therapeutic equipment, play materials and resources, this fundraising partnership has enabled the unit to thrive, matching standards of care offered at major London hospitals

Enhancing staffing

As part of this commitment, we have been raising funds since 2005 to support increased staff levels in local hospitals including the long-term funding of a Health Care Assistant and a new Haematology-Oncologist post at the Princess Royal University Hospital, Farnborough, both making a profound difference to standards of patient care and to the operations of the medical teams overseeing treatment.

Improving facilities

Our support has also included the complete refurbishment of the Treatment Suite and the procurement of new state-of-the-art facilities and clinical and therapeutic equipment. We also campaigned successfully to prevent the closure of a vital In-Patients Ward at the PRUH.

Funding Clinical research

We have funded pioneering clinical research projects in the development of new cancer therapies at King's College Hospital, London, breaking new ground in gene editing. We have recently agreed to support a research project in to the treatment of primary central nervous system lymphoma.

Financing Capital projects

We recently raised £750,000 through 'The Lily Pad Appeal' to create a new oncology section of the 'Rainbow Children's Unit' as part of a transformational re-development of Paediatric Services at Croydon University Hospital.

Delivering Childhood Cancer Support Groups

We fund and co-ordinate vital cancer support groups in London and the South-East. Regular meet-ups and trips in fun, safe and protected environments offer an amazing support system and a lifeline to neutropenic children, their siblings and parents at a very difficult time.

Funding AV1 No Isolation Robots

We fundraise to bring inspirational, life-changing technology to young patients, families and schools. We fund and maintain a small army of remote education robots allowing young cancer and leukaemia patients to access their schooling remotely during and after treatment.

Supporting Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Units and Wards

We respond to staff wish-lists on an ongoing basis providing year-round supplies of games, toys, arts and crafts materials and entertainment for young in-patients undergoing treatment as well as funding redecoration, kitchen fit outs and therapeutic and medical equipment.

Financing the Isle of Wight Oncology Holiday Home

We run and maintain Sophie's Wish, a three-bedroom luxury lodge for exclusive use by oncology families. Located close to a Paediatric Oncology Unit, families can enjoy time away, safe in the knowledge that they can access medical facilities with ease.

Developing 'The Oncology Guide' App

We are funding the development of a pioneering new app – an innovative tech powered solution giving oncology children and families all over the country easy access to comprehensive, high quality education resources direct to their phone or tablet.

The Oncology Guide is an invaluable tool for families living through the ordeal of cancer using technology to transform how parents and children gain instant access to reliable, digestible and comprehensive information. It simply wouldn't have been possible to get this project off the ground without the vital support of The Chartwell Cancer Trust.
